Disability welfare theory, social work

Brief explanation regarding specialization

(1) For social work, particularly the domain of disability welfare, I conduct practical implementation-based research on the establishment of drill programs aimed at consultation support specialists, etc. and the training of facilitators. (2) From the standpoint of the protection of rights, I conduct research on: (a) implementation pertaining to decision-making support and adult guardianship and (b) fieldwork intended to improve the quality of assistive efforts, such as preventing physical abuse at facilities for the disabled and preparing individual assistance plans.

Social security, poverty issues

Brief explanation regarding specialization

Measures for National Qualification Examination for Certified Social Worker

I convey the knowledge required to obtain certification and ways of thinking as a social worker with respect to the nineteen subjects on the National Qualification Examination for Certified Social Worker. A social worker hears out consultations by all kinds of socially-vulnerable people and assists them while simultaneously coordinating helpers so that those people may live their lives easier. A social worker is also an all-mighty specialized profession in the implementation of welfare that is counted on to grasp welfare needs and form mechanisms necessitated by regions. Together with our students, we study measures for obtaining the national qualification for that profession.
